Bromyard RFC Disciplinary Procedure

Document to be reviewed 1st August each year at season start.



CLUB DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

Bromyard RFC has a Disciplinary Committee which has the power to inflict appropriate punishment on any player, official or member of the Club for an infringement of any Laws of the Game provided that such powers are without prejudice to the powers of NMRFU to deal with such matters in accordance with the powers delegated to them by the Rugby Football Union.

Bromyard RFC shall be responsible for the conduct of its members, and for investigating any allegations of foul play and/or acts of misconduct which have taken place on Club premises or as part of a club activity unless set out to the contrary of the Disciplinary Regulations.

Bromyard RFC appoints a Disciplinary Panel, consisting of a Chairman plus two panel members and a secretary (who will be appointed but will not be a member of the panel).

A Player need not have been disciplined by an Official in order to appear before a Club Disciplinary Committee.

If a Player is punished for a foul play offence, which was undetected by an Official, Bromyard RFC should inform the Secretary of the opposing Club of the verdict and action taken.

CODE OF RUGBY - ADULT

Everyone involved in rugby in England, whether as a player, coach, referee, administrator, parent or spectator is expected to uphold the Core Values of our sport.

Teamwork - Respect - Enjoyment - Discipline - Sportsmanship

Coaches, match officials and other volunteers, are responsible for ensuring appropriate standards of behaviour are maintained at all times and must report all behaviour which falls below these standards. It is also important to ensure that misconduct occurring before and after the game is dealt with as robustly as that occurring during the game. Standards of behaviour should be enforced at all times, even when the behaviour goes unnoticed by match officials.

What Needs Reporting?

The following is an overview of those issues which the RFU regard as serious in respect of which the RFU expects Clubs to take the appropriate disciplinary action:

- Dismissal of a player
- Abuse of Officials
- Action which results in the abandonment of the game
- Misconduct contrary to the spirit of the game
- Yellow cards
- Repetitive behaviour where the player has failed to respond to informal interventions

Coaches and match officials must report all such incidents to a member of the committee within 48 hours of the match ending.

SENDING OFF

Where a player is sent off the team captain and/or coach must inform the club secretary and/or the club discipline secretary immediately.

The club secretary must report to NMFRU Discipline Secretary **within 48 hours** after the match the name, address and contact telephone number of any player who has been ordered off the playing enclosure.

Where possible, when a player is ordered-off the field of play, an internal club hearing in accordance with BRFC Discipline Hearing Procedure should be convened by the Club Discipline Secretary as soon as possible.

It may be that the NMFRU Discipline Secretary will require the player to attend a NMRFU Disciplinary hearing before the club has had time to convene, in that case the NMFRU Disciplinary hearing should take priority.

If a player is required to attend a hearing, it is important that they attend with someone from the club familiar with the Laws of the Game (in particular Law 9 – Foul Play), the disciplinary process and knows the player well and can speak on their behalf.

Even if the Clubs Disciplinary Panel has considered the case, please note that the player is still provisionally suspended under RFU Regulation 19 (by virtue of the fact that they were ordered-off) and cannot play until their case has been heard by NMFRU. Both the player and club may face an

additional charge for breaching RFU Rules/Regulations if a player plays before their case has been considered by the NMRFU Disciplinary Panel.

BRFC DISCIPLINE HEARING PROCEDURE

BRFC Disciplinary Panel exists to ensure high standard of conduct within the club and that there is a fair and proper administrative process to deal with any allegations of member's misconduct.

RFU Regulation 19, Appendix 7 sets out a step-by-step process to follow when holding a disciplinary hearing.

1. PRELIMINARY POINTS FOR ALL HEARINGS

Introduction of the panel

Check there are no objections to the composition of the panel

Introduction of all the parties (names and roles etc.)

Chair then reads out the charge and asks the accused person to confirm if they accept or deny the charge(s)

- 2. IF THE ACCUSED PERSON ACCEPTS THE CHARGE
- They should be asked to talk through the incident. During this time, they may be asked to talk through any video footage (if available)
- The accused person will then be asked to put forward any mitigation (Regulation 19.11.10)
- The opposition club (for example, in the case of a youth citing that a club is dealing with) may wish to make submissions on any aggravating factors (19.11.5(b))
- The accused person will then be asked by the panel about their previous disciplinary record (19.11.5.c)
- 3. THE PANEL SHOULD THEN CLEAR THE ROOM TO DELIBERATE IN PRIVATE
- The panel will undertake an assessment of the seriousness of the incident (19.11.8) and establish the entry point in line with the sanctions table at Appendix 2 of the RFU Regulations
- The panel will then consider whether there are any mitigating factors (19.11.10)
- The panel should then consider all aggravating factors (19.11.13)
- 4. THE PARTIES SHOULD THEN BE CALLED BACK AND THE DECISION GIVEN TO ALL AT THE SAME TIME
- 5. THE ACCUSED PERSON SHOULD BE ADVISED OF THEIR RIGHT TO APPEAL (AS PER THE CLUB'S INTERNAL CONSTITUTION/ RULES)
- 6. IF THE ACCUSED PERSON DENIES THE CHARGE
- The party bringing the charge (i.e. the Club Disciplinary Secretary) should present the case including calling any witnesses in person or by phone. The accused person or their representative should be given the opportunity to question each of the witnesses
- The video evidence should be shown (if applicable)
- The match referee should be called to give their evidence and the accused person or their representative given the chance to ask questions
- The panel has the opportunity to put any questions to the accused person or any witness
- 7. THE PANEL SHOULD THEN CLEAR THE ROOM TO DELIBERATE IN PRIVATE AS TO WHETHER OR NOT THERE IS A CASE TO ANSWER. THE PARTIES WILL THEN BE CALLED BACK.
- If there is insufficient evidence to justify a case to answer then the charge is dismissed
- If it is established that there is a case to answer the panel proceeds to hear evidence from the accused person
- The accused person may give evidence on their version of events, including by reference to the video footage, if available. The Secretary bringing the charge then has the opportunity to ask any questions

- The accused person may then call any witnesses upon which he/she relies and they can be asked questions by the Secretary
- The panel has the opportunity to put any questions to the accused person or any witness
- 8. THE PANEL SHOULD THEN CLEAR THE ROOM TO DELIBERATE IN PRIVATE
- If the charge is not proven, the case is dismissed
- If the charge is proven, the panel should then follow steps 3 5 above

Dealing with Player Disciplinary Issues - Under 7 to Under 12 General Principles

Given the young age of some of the players in this age range, it is imperative that all matters involving issues of discipline are dealt with as quickly and as sensitively as possible always remembering that the welfare of the child concerned is paramount. All actions taken against any child must be fair, consistent and reasonable in the circumstances. Players of this age should be dealt with informally, where possible, and in consultation with a parent/carer. As a general rule all disciplinary matters will be dealt with by the coach in consultation with the match officials and the parent/carer at the time of the incident. Outcomes of disciplinary actions are strictly confidential and must not be reported publicly.

Dealing with Issues of Low to Medium Level Seriousness

Where problems arise on the field of play, match officials and coaches are encouraged to withdraw players from the game rather than have the player dismissed. This should be followed by a discussion with the parent/carer of the child concerned and, if necessary, an informal discussion with the player themselves. Where necessary, informal advice and guidance regarding future conduct should be given to both the parent/care and the player. A written record of the incident and action taken must be kept and a copy given to the Rugby Chairman and the Child Safeguarding Officer.

Dealing with Issues of High Level Seriousness

On the rare occasion when the behaviour complained of is so serious that it requires a more formal intervention (for example, where there is a pattern of behaviour developing and the player has failed to respond to the informal interventions or where there the behaviour involves a serious level of violence such as biting, deliberate stamping etc), the player should be withdrawn

from the field of play by the coach in consultation with the match officials. The matter should then be discussed with the Chairman of Mini Junior Rugby and Child Safeguarding Officer who will decide whether the matter can be dealt with informally or referred for formal action to be taken. A written record of the incident must be kept and a copy given to the Rugby Chairman and Child Safeguarding Officer.

Dealing with Player Disciplinary Issues - Under 13 to Under 18 Age General principles

Coaches, match officials and other volunteers, are responsible for ensuring appropriate standards of behaviour are maintained at all times and must report all behaviour which falls below these standards. It is also important to ensure that misconduct occurring before and after the game is dealt with as robustly as that occurring during the game. Standards of behaviour should be enforced at all times, even when the behaviour goes unnoticed by match officials. Given the age of the players in this age range, it is imperative that all matters involving issues of discipline are dealt with as quickly and as sensitively as possible always remembering that the welfare of the young person concerned is paramount. All actions taken against any young player must be fair, consistent and reasonable in the circumstances and be taken in accordance with the guidelines set out below. Outcomes of disciplinary action are strictly confidential and must not be reported publicly.

Needs Reporting?

The guidance from the RFU is clear in respect of dealing with disciplinary matters for players in this age range and sets out circumstances in which it is expects Clubs to respond. The following is an overview of those issues which the RFU regard as serious in respect of which the RFU expects Clubs to take the appropriate disciplinary action:

- Dismissal of a player
- Abuse of Officials
- Action which results in the abandonment of the game
- Misconduct contrary to the spirit of the game
- Yellow cards
- Repetitive behaviour where the player has failed to respond to informal interventions Coaches and match offices must report all such incidents to the Chair of Mini Junior Rugby or the Child Safeguarding Officer **within** 48 hours of the match ending

How Will Disciplinary Matters be Dealt With?

All disciplinary matters for players in these age groups will be dealt with by the Disciplinary Panel and in consultation with the Child Safeguarding Officer. The Disciplinary Panel shall consists of such persons as it is felt necessary to deal with the matter complained of and will include people with an understanding of Age Grade rugby and who have been DBS checked. The coach and the parent/carer will be involved throughout the process by the Club Secretary who will be responsible for providing administrative support and procedural advice.

The Disciplinary Panel will have regard to the guidance set out in Regulation 10 of the RFU Disciplinary Rules and Regulations when dealing with disciplinary matters. If the matter complained of is denied, it may be necessary to convene a formal disciplinary hearing. However, this would not be done without full consultation with the Child Safeguarding Officer and the parent/carer.

The Disciplinary Panel is authorised to impose all sanctions as set out below (from the RFU Disciplinary Rules and Regulations as they relate to youth players). Where it is felt necessary to consider greater sanction such as expulsion from the Club, the Club Safeguarding Officer must be consulted. A full report of the investigation, hearing if any and outcome will be sent to the NMRFU Safeguarding Manager.

In respect of offences not referred to in Appendix 1, appropriate sanctions may be imposed at the discretion of the relevant Judicial Officer, Disciplinary Committee, Appeal Officer and/or Appeal Committee (as the case may be).

Notwithstanding the Sanctions in Appendix 1 and/or the provisions of Regulation 19 in cases where the player's actions constitute mid-range or top end offending for any type of offence which had the potential to result and, in fact, did result in serious/gross consequences to the health of the victim, the Judicial Officers and/or Disciplinary Committees may impose any period of suspension including a suspension for life.

Bad Disciplinary Record

When dealing with a Club under the bad disciplinary record provisions a Disciplinary Panel may impose any appropriate sanction, including (but not limited to) a reprimand, a financial penalty or deduction of league points or relegation, exclusion or disqualification from any competition, or a combination of the above. Sanctions may also be suspended if considered appropriate.

Under Age Players who train/play in Adult Rugby

This recommended sanctions table relates to an entry point for a first breach of RFU Regulation 15. The sanction may be increased to reflect aggravating features or reduced to reflect mitigating factors (see below). A second breach is likely to incur a significantly higher sanction.

- · Player nearly 18 years old
- Player capable of playing adult rugby and permission would have been granted had it been requested
- Injury not serious
